Devotional:

If the Lord Wills

James 4:13-15

Come now, you who say, "Today or tomorrow we will go into such and such a town and spend a year there and trade and make a profit"— yet you do not know what tomorrow will bring. What is your life? For you are a mist that appears for a little time and then vanishes. Instead, you ought to say, "If the Lord wills, we will live and do this or that."

The people that James was addressing were merchants who travelled from town to town selling and trading goods. They presumed upon future times and things which were not in their power. Perhaps they thought they would live forever and had plenty of time. Their focus was entirely on worldly goods with no thought of such things for the glory of God.

"There are two great certainties about things that shall come to pass – one is that God knows, and the other is that we do not know. (Spurgeon)

James asks us to consider the fragility of human life and the fact that we live and move only at the permission of God. Life is a momentary vapour. James does not discourage us from planning and doing, only from planning and doing apart from reliance on God. Yet I hear so many making plans often long term without any reference to God and his kingdom.

Time is short. We should think about the story Jesus told of the rich man who had great plans for a future good life and lost it all when his soul was required of him (Luke12:16-21)

Procrastination, saying "when I get the time or have the money", or "after I have done this" or been there" are some of the many excuses we have for not seeking the kingdom above all else.

Paul knew and lived this principle: I will return again to you, God willing (Acts 18:21). But I will come to you shortly if the Lord wills (1 Corinthians4:19). I hope to stay a while with you if the Lord permits (1 Corinthians16:7).

James has already stated (James 4:6) that boasting about what you are going to do is in fact "a wicked, positive sin, and a specimen of ungodly haughtiness of which men should repent." (Moffat)

If we rely on God, including Him in all our plans and seek his kingdom first, we will be richly rewarded and finish our lives with great satisfaction to the glory of God.
